Elizabethtown College's Young Center for Anabaptist and Pietist Studies hosts Joe A. Springer on March 24 and 25, 2022

Joe A. Springer's lecture, "That I may sing a song": Early Anabaptist Hymnals on Thursday, March 24, at 7:00pm will be held both inperson in the Susquehanna Room of Myer Hall at Elizabethtown College and also via Zoom.

Springer will share recent scholarship on the earliest hymnals published by Germanspeaking Anabaptists in the 16th century. He will devote particular attention to the 1564 *Etliche schöne Christliche Geseng*, the first known edition of the *Ausbund* hymnal still in use among Old Order Amish today.
